#### **LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // GOD**

God is worthy of our worship, and to misplace attention or affections to worldly things which are rightly owed to God is idolatry.

We know all about honor and worship because we do it all the time. Football fans show both honor and worship through their actions and commitment. A football game involves fewer than twenty minutes of actual action. Yet football fans willingly spend three hours or more watching a game that provides only a few minutes of action. If you actually go to the game, you have to add driving time, parking, walking to the stadium, and then sitting in the traffic gridlock when the game is over. But have you ever heard a football fan complain that the game went too long? No, because when we value something, we gladly commit our time to it.

Translate that willingness and enthusiasm over to our spiritual lives matters like church attendance, personal Bible study, or prayer—and too many of us are satisfied with a quick five-minute devotion and short prayer. In fact, if we committed just twelve minutes per day, five days a week to reading the Bible, we would make it through all sixty-six books in less than a year. Yet many believers say this is too great a commitment. The Ten Commandments call us to honor God. The ways we spend our time says a lot about what we truly value. Are we truly honoring God?



#### Day One **MARK 6:1**

The place where Jesus grew up was a small village about 70 miles north of Jerusalem, and in Nazareth, just like in small towns all across America, everybody knew everybody. Jesus was about 30 years old when He began His public ministry (Luke 3:23), and for all the years leading up to that time, Jesus' neighbors had known Him as the carpenter's son. As far as they knew, Jesus was just like every other Nazarene. However, it seems they'd failed to understand that it "was spoken through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene" (Matt. 2:23). For 30 years, Jesus—God in the flesh—lived humbly and in a way that didn't grab the attention of His neighbors. But it was just a matter of time before His true character shone through.

Why did the people in Nazareth fail to recognize who Jesus truly was?

Why did Jesus live humbly among His neighbors?

#### Day Two **MARK 6:2**



When Jesus came to Nazareth, it was to visit His folks—He'd come to do ministry among the people. One of Jesus' practices was, when He entered a town, He'd first go to the synagogue to teach. This is what He did in His hometown, too. And as it commonly happened, the people who heard Jesus teach were blown away! Further, Jesus had been doing ministry throughout Galilee, and the people in Nazareth had undoubtedly heard stories of the miracles Jesus had performed. They'd never heard anything like the insights Jesus shared or seen anything like His miracles, and like so many others, they wondered where He got such wisdom and power.

Why were people filled with wonder at the teachings and miracles of Jesus?

How was Jesus able to teach and perform miracles the ways He did?

### Day Three **MARK 6:3**

Because Jesus had grown up in Nazareth, everyone knew who He was—the son of Mary and Joseph. And as far as they were concerned. He was just like every other person who had grown up in their town. Whereas their first response was one of wonder, that soon turned to offense. In this context, it means the people of Nazareth "stumbled" or were "entangled" by the things they saw and heard from Jesus. Whereas the purpose of Jesus' teaching and miracles was to help people believe, overcoming the weakness of their faith, for some, it had the opposite effect. For those who refused to believe because of prideful hard-heartedness, the teaching and miracles caused them to stumble, further hardening their hearts. The people from Jesus' hometown—His neighbors—refused to receive Jesus and the things He taught. Instead, they were offended.

Why do some people find Jesus offensive?

What are the consequences of refusing Jesus' teachings?

# Day Four MARK 6:4

There's a common saying, familiarity brings contempt. This means that as we spend more and more time with someone or in a certain place, we become comfortable and may lose sight of the things that make that person or place special. For instance, several years ago, I moved into the mountains to an elevation of about 9000 feet. The first time I drove up the pass into the town where we were moving, I was overwhelmed at the beauty of the mountains. But after only a short time, I barely paid attention to the landscape all around me—I'd become too familiar. This is the same issue that affected the people of Nazareth. They were so familiar with Jesus, that they failed to see the wisdom and power that were inherently characteristic of who He was. Because of this, they refused to show Him the honor that He rightly deserved.

How have you become overly familiar with Jesus?

What steps will you take to make sure you show Jesus the honor He deserves?

# Day Five MARK 6:5-6



This verse doesn't mean that the people's lack of faith rendered Jesus powerless to do miracles. Instead, because of their unbelief, Jesus chose not to do miracles. Scripture teaches that there is "harsher judgment" for those who willfully refuse God after being exposed to the light (Mark 12:40). The hearts of the Nazarenes were so hard that their unbelief literally amazed Jesus. Of course, because Jesus is God, He has supernatural wisdom. But in His humanity, He was simply astounded by their bold claims to know Him, all the while refusing to acknowledge who He truly was. Jesus mercifully spared the Nazarenes from more severe punishment by not doing miracles among them. Through the Scriptures, Jesus has revealed Himself to us. We are called to show Him the honor He deserves.

Why was Jesus amazed at the unbelief of His neighbors?

How does your life show that you honor Iesus above all?
